Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Communities

Enabling the context for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Community Controlled Birthing on Country services: Participatory action research Birthing on Country services have demonstrated health and cost benefits and require redesign of maternity care. During the *Building On Our Strengths* feasibility study, use of endorsed midwives and licensing of birth centres has proven difficult. Participatory action research identified implementation barriers. The researchers conducted an iterative document analysis of instruments to inform government lobbying through synthesis of policy, economic, social, technological, legal, and environmental factors. More>

When physical activity programs include cultural elements, they are even better for First Nations people Through many social inequities, First Nations peoples are more likely to experience mental health issues. This review describes how physical activity that includes cultural practices can help. More>

Pregnancy and Birth

The use of gender-neutral language in maternity settings: a narrative literature review Staying up to date with contemporary issues enhances their ability to provide high-quality evidence-based care. One aspect of maternal care that is changing is the use of gender-neutral language. The aim of this review was to examine the use of gender-neutral language in maternity settings and collate the literature to expose any knowledge gaps. More>

<u>Inclusive Birthing Language Poster for Midwives</u> Inclusive language is a way of acknowledging and respecting the diversity of peoples' bodies, genders and relationships. As midwives and birth workers, using inclusive language supports people to feel safe within the health system, acknowledges who they are, and embraces LGBTQ+ Rainbow Families. <u>More></u>

NSW Health LGBTIQ+ health information and resources website provides a range of resources and supports, including mental health and suicide prevention support, links to LGBTIQ+ community organisations, information about providing care to LGBTIQ+ communities, language and terminology, and LGBTIQ+ resources by health topic. <u>A systematic review of the cost-effectiveness of maternity models of care</u> In this systematic review, the authors aimed to identify the full extent of cost-effectiveness evidence available for evaluating alternative Maternity Models of Care (MMC) and to summarize findings narratively. <u>More></u>

Reduction in spontaneous and iatrogenic preterm births in twin pregnancies during COVID-19 lockdown in Melbourne, Australia: a multicentre cohort study Melbourne, recorded one of the longest and most stringent pandemic lockdowns in 2020, which was associated with an increase in preterm stillbirths among singleton pregnancies. Twin pregnancies may be particularly susceptible to the impacts of pandemic disruptions to maternity care due to their higher background risk of adverse perinatal outcomes. More>

<u>Maternity clinician use of shared decision-making in antenatal care: A scoping review</u> Implementation of shared decision-making in antenatal care has had limited exploration. This review aimed to assess what is known about shared decision-making in antenatal care. <u>More></u>





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Pregnancy and Birth

A scoping review of the reasons for and approaches to non-uptake of pertussis and influenza vaccinations in pregnant women in the United Kingdom and Ireland Pertussis and influenza cause significant morbidity and mortality in pregnancy and the neonatal period. Maternal vaccination in pregnancy would reduce harm, but low vaccine uptake is a concern. This scoping review aimed to understand the reasons for, and approaches, to non-uptake of pertussis and influenza vaccinations in pregnant women in the UK and Ireland. More>

<u>Critical Windows of Maternal Exposure to Biothermal Stress and Birth Weight for Gestational Age in Western Australia</u> There is limited and inconsistent evidence on the risk of ambient temperature on small for gestational age (SGA) and there are no known related studies for large for gestational age (LGA). This research examines the associations and critical susceptible windows of maternal exposure to a biothermal metric [Universal Thermal Climate Index (UTCI)] and the hazards of SGA and LGA. <u>More></u>

Barriers and enablers to antenatal care attendance for women referred to social work services in a Victorian regional hospital: A qualitative descriptive study Women referred to social work services during pregnancy are more likely to experience social disadvantage than those who are not, resulting in reduced antenatal care attendance. This study aimed to explore the barriers and enablers to antenatal care attendance by women referred to social work services from the perspectives of women, and clinicians who provide antenatal healthcare. More>

A content analysis of women's experiences of different models of maternity care: the Birth Experience Study (BESt) Pregnancy, birth, and early parenthood are significant life experiences impacting women and their families. Growing evidence suggests models of maternity care impact clinical outcomes and birth experiences. The aim of this study was to explore the strengths and limitations of different maternity models of care accessed by women in Australia who had given birth in the past 5 years. More>

Telehealth use in maternity care during a pandemic: A lot of bad, some good and possibility To reduce transmission risk during the COVID-19 pandemic, 'telehealth' was implemented into Australian maternity services. Whilst some reports on telehealth implementation ensued, there was scant evidence on women and midwives' perspectives regarding telehealth use. This study was conducted in Australia during 2020–2021 using two data sources from the Birth in the Time of COVID-19 (BITTOC) study: interviews and surveys. More>

Induction of labour and caesarean birth in lower-risk nulliparous women at term: A retrospective cohort study This population-based retrospective cohort study of all births in Victoria, Australia, from 2010 to 2018 (n = 640,191), aimed to evaluate whether induction of labour is associated with caesarean birth and perinatal mortality in uncomplicated first births at term compared with expectant management outside the confines of a randomized controlled trial. More>

Perinatal morbidity among women with a previous caesarean delivery (PRISMA trial): a cluster-randomised trial Women with a previous caesarean birth face a difficult choice in their next pregnancy: planning another caesarean or attempting vaginal delivery, both of which are associated with potential maternal and perinatal complications. This trial aimed to assess whether a multifaceted intervention, which promoted person-centred decision making and best practices, would reduce the risk of major perinatal morbidity among women with one previous caesarean delivery. 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Pregnancy and Birth

WHO recommendations on the assessment of postpartum blood loss and use of a treatment bundle for postpartum haemorrhage In 2023, the World Health Organization (WHO) convened a Guideline Development Group to update an existing recommendation on assessing postpartum haemorrhage (PPH) and consider using a care bundle to treat PPH. This document issues an updated recommendation on the assessment of PPH and a new recommendation on the use of a treatment bundle for the management of PPH. More>

Effective and simple interventions to improve outcomes for preterm infants worldwide: The FIGO PremPrep-5 initiative Preterm birth remains the leading cause of mortality among under-5's and is a major contributor to the reduction in quality-of-life adjusted years and reduction in human capital. Globally, there are many interventions and care bundles that aim to reduce the impact of preterm birth once preterm labour has ensued and into the neonatal period; not all of these are applicable in all settings. This article introduces the FIGO PremPrep-5 initiative, which aims to disseminate key information on the most simple and effective interventions with the aim of increasing implementation globally. More>

Maternal disability and initiation and duration of breastfeeding: analysis of a Canadian cross-sectional survey Known risk factors for breastfeeding non-initiation and early cessation of breastfeeding are diverse and include low breastfeeding self-efficacy, poverty, smoking, obesity, and chronic illness. Although women with disabilities experience elevated rates of these risk factors. This study examines breastfeeding non-initiation and early cessation of breastfeeding in women with and without disabilities. More>

<u>Perinatal depression and risk of mortality: nationwide, register based study in Sweden</u> This study aimed to determine whether women with perinatal depression are at an increased risk of death compared with women who did not develop perinatal depression, and compared with full sisters. Even when accounting for familial factors, women with clinically diagnosed perinatal depression were associated with an increased risk of death, particularly during the first year after diagnosis and because of suicide. <u>More></u>

Common mental disorders and perinatal outcomes in Victoria, Australia: A population-based retrospective cohort study Common mental issues (non-psychotic mental health conditions which impact on day-to-day functioning) are increasingly common in childbearing women and may impact significantly on both maternal and neonatal outcomes. This study examines the associations between common mental disorders and perinatal outcomes. More>

<u>Perinatal Mental Health Support Finder</u> online resource listing developed for Perinatal Mental Health Week includes partners who support the initiative and provide support services. Services and resources can be filtered by State, client/partner/support person or health professional, and type of support required. <u>More></u>

Child and Family Health and Wellbeing

Mental health in the two years following hypertensive and normotensive pregnancy: The Postpartum, Physiology, Psychology and Paediatric follow-up (P4) cohort study Postpartum mental issues and hypertensive disorders of pregnancy (HDP) are both common, and both associated with adverse maternal and child health outcomes. However, the relationship between them is unclear. This study aimed to investigate prevalence and symptom severity of depression, anxiety, and post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) 2-years postpartum in women with normal blood pressure (NBP) during pregnancy versus preeclampsia or gestational hypertension (GH). More>





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Child and Family Health and Wellbeing

<u>What is family?</u> report from our Families in Australia study show that there is a wide range of views when it comes to defining a family. Cultural and personal life experiences shape the way people define family, unconditional support and love are important in defining families. <u>More></u>

What is 'parent training' for families of children with ADHD? ADHD can significantly influence family dynamics and can affect a child's ability to learn and interact socially. Raising children with behavioural, developmental or learning difficulties can also make parenting more challenging, with parents navigating feelings of frustration, grief and guilt. While medication is most effective at minimising core ADHD symptoms, non-drug interventions can also reduce the daily impacts of ADHD symptoms. Parenting/family training is one such intervention. More>

<u>Using the Australian Early Development Census (AEDC) data to support thriving children</u> in 2021, the fifth AEDC was undertaken with 305,015 children in their first year of full-time school. AEDC is a nationwide measure of early childhood development that shines a light on what is working well and where we have more work to do. Each Data Story in the series considers trends and how AEDC data can inform priorities, policies and practice to improve outcomes for children. <u>More></u>

<u>Pertussis online course</u> Pertussis, commonly known as whooping cough, is one of the least controlled vaccine-preventable diseases. Gain an understanding of pertussis in Australia, including immunisation rates, prevention and symptoms in both adults and children. <u>More></u>

1 in 4 adults think smacking is necessary to 'properly raise' kids. But attitudes are changing The United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child considers smacking and all types of physical punishment, however mild, a violation of child rights. It's banned in 65 countries. Yet it remains legal in Australia for parents to use "reasonable force" for discipline. Children are the only group of people it remains legal to hit. This research found one in four Australians still think physical punishment is necessary to "properly raise" children. And half of parents (across all age groups) reported smacking their children. More>

<u>Traffic Lights®: Sexual behaviours in children and young people- Distance Education</u> Gain skills to identify, understand and respond to a broad range of sexual behaviours in children and young people, ranging from behaviours that are typical and developmentally appropriate to those that are harmful or problematic and signal the need for follow up and support. <u>More></u>

Do kids grow out of Attention-deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) as they get older? ADHD is more often diagnosed in children. That might make you wonder if people grow out of it as they reach adulthood. ADHD is a neurodevelopmental disorder that involves difficulties focusing attention (for study or work) and/or sitting still or keeping impulsive actions in check. This means people with ADHD are different and the differences are there for life. But development is a dynamic process because people change, mature and develop their skills. If people have ADHD, the way it affects them can change over time too. More>

Extreme Heat Affects Early Childhood Development and Health Globally, 2023 is believed to have been the hottest year on record. This working paper explores how extreme heat can affect young children's biological systems and disrupt development, as well as the many ways it can amplify the effects of systemic inequities. The paper offers strategies to mitigate the impact of extreme heat and provide new ways of cooling the places where children live, grow, learn, and play. More>

<u>3 ways to help your child transition off screens and avoid the dreaded 'tech tantrums'</u> Many Australian parents worry about how much time their children spend watching screens. While some time on devices is fine for entertainment and education, we also know it is important children do things away from TVs and devices. This means for many families, there is a daily battle around getting kids off their screens and avoiding "tech tantrums". This new research looks at how parents and carers can help children with what researchers call "technology transitions". More>

Good lunchboxes are based on 4 things: here's how parents can prepare healthy food and keep costs down Heading back to school is a time of great anticipation for many families, but it is not without challenges. One of the big challenges is preparing healthy, easy, affordable and appealing lunchboxes. Lunchboxes are vital for supporting children's energy levels throughout the school day, which in turn helps maintain their concentration. More>

Women's Sexual and Reproductive Health

A life-course approach to tackling noncommunicable diseases (NCDs) in women In almost every country in the world, NCDs are the leading causes of death for women. Among these, cardiovascular disease (including heart disease and stroke) and cancer are the major causes of mortality. Risks for these conditions exist at each stage of women's lives, but recognition of the unique needs of women for the prevention and management of NCDs is relatively recent and still emerging. The authors of this article call for a strategic, innovative life-course approach to identifying disease triggers and instigating cost-effective measures to minimize exposure in a timely manner. More>

Symptoms of menopause can make it harder to work. Here's what employers should be doing How menopause affects women's working lives has been shrouded by stigma for decades. This global review of organisational supports for menstruation and menopause found workplaces play a pivotal role in breaking menopausal taboos. With the right interventions, workplaces can enable employees to manage their symptoms and remain in the workforce. More>

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Domestic and Family Violence, Trauma, Sexual Assault and Child Protection

How both health and safety are compromised for people living with long COVID and intimate partner violence What happens when a person is experiencing long COVID and intimate partner violence at the same time? Previous research shows women who are victim-survivors of intimate partner violence are twice as likely to develop long-term illnesses, including chronic fatigue syndrome and fibromyalgia. Global studies estimate one in ten infected people go on to develop long COVID symptoms. This research reveals the previously unseen impacts of long COVID on individuals experiencing domestic violence. More>

<u>Family, domestic and sexual violence</u> AIHW webpage brings together information from a range of sources to provide a comprehensive picture of family, domestic and sexual violence in Australia and summarises changes in key measures over time. Regular updates are made to include the latest data for key national data sources. <u>More></u>

National Principles to Address Coercive Control in Family Domestic Violence The Australian Government has collaborated with all state and territory governments to develop the National Principles to Address Coercive Control in Family and Domestic Violence (the National Principles). The National Principles create a shared national understanding of coercive control, which is important for improving the safety of Australians, particularly women and children. More>

Best practice principles for working with men from refugee backgrounds who use domestic and family violence: Key findings and future directions ANROWS research provides a set of principles of practice for interventions with men from refugee backgrounds who use domestic and family violence, including understand violence in the context of refugee trauma, understand violence in the context of settlement challenges, recognise refugee family and community structures. More>

<u>Specialist Approaches to Managing Sexual Assault Proceedings: An Integrative Review</u> addresses two principal concerns – systemic barriers to reporting sexual violence, and the re-traumatisation experienced when engaging with the criminal justice system. It identifies and evaluates the specialist measures designed to address these concerns in sexual offences courts/lists, and in three comparative domains: child sexual offences courts/lists, DFV courts/lists and specialist prosecution units. <u>More></u>

Efficacy and moderators of efficacy of cognitive behavioural therapies with a trauma focus in children and adolescents: an individual participant data meta-analysis of randomised trials Existing clinical trials of cognitive behavioural therapies with a trauma focus (CBTs-TF) are underpowered to examine key variables that might moderate treatment effects. This study aimed to determine the efficacy of CBTs-TF for young people, relative to passive and active control conditions, and elucidate putative individual-level and treatment-level moderators. More>

<u>Understanding the Science and Reality of Obesity for Better Patient Care E-Learning Module</u> provides information about the science of obesity, personal experiences of patients and healthcare professionals, quick tips for best practice and opportunities to reflect on practice. Positive interactions with a healthcare professional can help clients better understand the science and complexity of obesity, their personal health risks, and their options. <u>More></u>

NSW Government campaign: Every vape is a hit to your health aims to address the issue of vaping by young people. The campaign 14–24-year-olds and encourages young people to consider the proven health harms of vaping, such as nicotine addiction, lung damage, breathlessness, nicotine poisoning and burns from exploding vapes. The campaign has been developed by the NSW Cancer institute in consultation with young people and medical experts and includes testimonial videos of young people who have experienced the health harms of vaping.
